If possible visit a Potter at work or let the girls work with clay or make the Peanut Butter Pottery recipe that follows.

Isaiah 64:8 tells how we are like clay and God is the Potter.

Clay has to be refined before it can be used, the stones and grit need to be removed before it is of any use. Once the rubbish has been removed, the clay is kneaded to remove the air bubbles, then when the clay is smooth and pliable it is ready to be made into a container.

We need to allow God to remove the rubbish from our lives before He can use us. Some times it takes a long time for all the grit, stones and bubbles – the weaknesses and specks of sin that are the rubbish in our lives, to be removed and we are pliable, ready to be moulded by God.

A Potter works with one hand shaping the vessel inside and the other pressing from the outside. God is shaping our lives from within and outside, His Holy Spirit and His people, always with His guiding hand.

Let God mould your life to create what He always intended you to be.



Peanut Butter Pottery

½ cup peanut butter
½ cup dry powered milk
1 tablespoon honey

Mix peanut butter and powered milk together, add the honey. The mixture will be crumbly, so knead together with your hands. If the mixture is too dry add more honey, if too moist more powered milk.

Form into small balls about the size of a walnut. Make an impression with your finger or wooden spoon handle. Gently shape into a 'pot'. This recipe makes 12 'pots'. You can fill the pots with sunflower seeds or sultanas. And they are good to eat!
